Workshop 1: Reclaiming Wahine Rituals o Ngāti Pāoa @ 2:10 PM in Ko Te Tangata



Herearoha Skipper - Ngāti Hako, Ngāti Tamaterā, Ngāti Pāoa, Ngāti Tara Tokanui Tawhaki, Ngāti Whanaunga, Ngāpuhi

Along with 30+ years experience in the education sector, Herearoha is the Director of Te Ara Tupu, Trustee for Ngāti Tamaterā Treaty Settlement Trust & Te Korowai Hauora o Hauraki, Chair for Ngāti Pāoa lwi Trust, and sits on several governance boards representing iwi as a Treaty partner. Herearoha is co-lead for Pou Rāhui and manages Kaupapa Māori Systems Change research. She provides oversight for Te Korowai Aroha, a project based on reclaiming traditional practices and decolonising through cultural knowledge for kōhine, wāhine, ruahine and their whānau to experience rituals of healing.



Rihipeti-Paerau Forbes - Ngāti Pāoa, Ngāti Maniapoto

Rihipeti-Paerau is currently pursuing a Master of Indigenous Studies at Waipapa Taumata Rau (UoA), while working alongside amazing mana wāhine at Ngāti Pāoa lwi Trust and E Tipu E Rea Whānau Services. She works with two bridging organisations focused on Te Korowai Aroha, a kaupapa aimed at reclaiming traditional practices around wāhinetanga for ngā wāhine o Pāoa. Outside of this mahi, Rihipeti-Paerau tutors and co-lectures a UoA staff beginners Te Reo Māori paper.

Karl is Director of ARAHIA Pathfinders, a founder and recent Co-Chair of Ngā Aho Inc network of Māori Design Professionals, a past President of the Designers Institute of NZ, member of the NZ Story Advisory Board, member of Toi Mai Workforce Development Council, board of Hawke's Bay Tourism and member of Te Mana Whakahaere o Te Wānanga o Aotearoa. Karl works at the intersection of culture, commerce and creativity – designing futures and making shift happen, using approaches founded and grounded in indigenous knowledge and creativity.
